weekly early release will allow students to participate in after school enrichment programs and provide valuable time for the faculty to meet and work on curriculum and staff development.

The P.E. Uniform has been transitioning over the last two years from white t-shirts to gray t-shirts. This year we will be fully implementing the policy. P.E. will continue on Tuesdays and Thursdays. The uniform for P.E. is as follows: (note: this is different from the Parent/Student handbook you have just received) every student in Kindergarten through Seventh Grade must wear navy shorts that are no shorter than two inches above the middle of the knee cap with the Pacific Crest Academy insignia, and a gray tee shirt with the Pacific Crest Academy insignia. Each student is to wear white athletic socks that come to at least mid ankle and unadorned athletic shoes, which are to be mostly white. During the winter, navy sweats and a navy crew neck or hooded navy blue sweatshirt with the Pacific Crest Academy insignia are required. All items can be purchased through Dennis Uniform.

With regard to the policy for the regular school uniform worn on Mondays, Wednesdays, and Fridays, please refer to your Parent/Student handbook beginning on page 13. Please pay close attention to the policy on hair accessories. The flower headbands may continue to be worn as long as they are one of the colors mentioned and the flower is white, navy blue, or green. However the size of the flower should be no larger than approximately 3 inches in diameter. We ask that you support us in the mission of character formation of your children and instill in them a healthy pride of wearing their uniform and knowing that it is a mark of distinction.

The student supply fee was not included as part of this coming year's registration fees. We have come to realize that this important detail was not communicated clearly. Please accept our sincerest apology for this. The Parent's Club with the help of the office staff are working hard to correct this matter. They will be purchasing the supplies in bulk and putting grade level student packages together. The Parent's Club will be forth coming with further communication regarding the packages as well as the cost. A table will be set up at Back to School Night to pay for your child's supplies. We feel it is the best solution and want to make it as simple and cost effective for you as possible.
